Parents and the School

We hope to build a relationship with each family which will continue beyond your pupils time at Hampstead Hill School. We are fortunate to have ties with many families where the parents once attended HHS themselves as children. Raising children is not just the responsibility of parents, it is also the responsibility of those individuals who dedicate their lives to the teaching and care of young children. It is important that close working relationships develop between Staff and parents in order that children may progress in all areas of development.

As HHS is a totally non-selective School, we will of course find in our midst pupils who need our support with learning difficulties or have English as a second language. We have a number of Staff who are able to devote themselves to ensuring that these children have as much time and attention as is needed.

You are warmly invited to discuss your child's progress with class teachers at any time - you simply have to give a little notice so that we can prepare for a short meeting. Formal parents' evenings will take place throughout the year, giving parents an opportunity to discuss their children's achievements and targets with the class teachers. Please see the Home School Communication Policy for the meeting and report schedule.

We rely on parents being honest with us regarding the welfare of their children. If a child is not behaving in character, there is usually an underlying problem and quite often this emanates from the home environment. We ask that you be open with us regarding any problems on the home front so that we can deal effectively with changes in a child's life and please keep your personal details up to date on your pupil registration form.

School Values

The school values, which drive our behaviour and curriculum are, respect, community, curiosity, kindness and conservation.

We aim to develop **respectful**, **community** centred children who are **curious** to learn, **kind** to others and the planet and understand the importance of sustainability and **conservation**.

The Nursery School

The Nursery School has two Year Groups, Early Years (2-3 years) and Pre-Reception (3-4 years) with four classes in each year.

We aim to provide a safe and happy environment in which young pupils can develop their social and academic skills. Our days are full of art and craft, music and movement, singing, physical activities both inside and outside in the garden, as well as academic pursuits which are introduced gradually and in keeping with each pupils' development. It is our intention to give each pupil a solid foundation across the curriculum, on which to build and thrive thereafter.

We are a School that is aware of the needs of working parents and therefore most of our pupils attend for longer days. Pupils are provided with regular snacks and meals and for younger pupils under 3 years of age there is an opportunity to sleep after lunch. All our food is from reliable and healthy sources and is cooked daily on the premises.

Extra-curricular Clubs are available from Pre-Reception Year, please see the section on Clubs later in this booklet.

Assessments for other Schools at 4+

Hampstead Hill is a School where most children remain until 7+ but there are always a few children who leave at 4+. Pupils sitting assessments for other Schools for 4+ entry remain on the

waiting list for entry to the Upper School – priority for places at HHS Pre-Prep School has always been given to those children whose parent's first choice is for them to remain with us to 7+.

It is imperative that you let us know if you are planning to sit your child for any 4+ assessments. At the start of the Pre-Reception Year you will be asked to complete a form relevant to this as other Schools ask us for reports.



The Pre-Prep School

The Pre-Prep School consists of three year groups, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. They have regular term times with a one week half term each term, which is preceded by a staff professional day when the school is closed, and then holiday periods between each term.

During the half term and holiday periods Hampstead Hill runs Holiday Schemes for these three year groups. We have full day workshops for various activities. Details of these are sent out approximately 2-3 weeks before the relevant period.

We also have local days out to Golders Hill Park and Hampstead Heath, activity days in school with Arts & Crafts and occasional outings and cinema/film days.

The cost of these activities varies from £20-£50 per day depending on the activities and the staff needed.

Reception Year

Reception Year is the start of formal Schooling and the school day begins at 9.00 am. Pupils are eased into a formal School day, which includes responsibilities and homework, and are expected to wear full uniform and to take pride in their appearance. Formal P.E. and Forest School begin in Reception Year.

During the Summer Term, the pupils will visit the Upper School building to meet their new teachers and familiarise themselves with the environment. It is extremely important that all pupils complete

their School year, especially as their Summer Show, Sports Day & Prizegiving ceremony take place during the last couple of weeks of the official School year.

Year 1 & Year 2

There are four classes in each Year Group. Year 1 pupils remain with their teachers for two terms and then move on to the Year 2 classes in the third term to prepare for the entrance assessments in the coming months. There are plenty of opportunities to meet formally and informally with the class teachers and you will be guided through the process of trying to choose a good selection of Schools for your child by the Principal, Headteacher and the Class Teachers.

Swimming and Computing are introduced from Year 1 onwards.

The doors to the Pre-Prep School open at 7.45am and are closed at 8.45am. The day starts formally at 8.50 am. Year 1 and Year 2 pupils finish at 3.40 pm. For those pupils who will remain at School after this time we provide a variety of clubs, which are operated by qualified professionals, as well as care. Please see the section on Extra-curricular Clubs later in this booklet.

Absences caused by illness must please be notified by telephone on the first morning of absence, and by 8.30 am. Absences not caused by illness require the permission of the Headteacher and must be made in writing - failure to do so results in unauthorised absence. It is a legal requirement that a note explaining any absence should be sent in when your child returns to School. Pre-Prep School Collection Times and Locations

Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 should be in by 9.00am every day. There is no change of fees depending on the collection time – Pre-Prep School fees are a standard amount for the 3 terms.

Parents must notify their Class Teacher of their regular pickup time at the beginning of the academic year, including any variations of their pickup time due to clubs.

The collection times and locations are as follows.

- 3.40pm Reception and Year 2 from the West Gate
- 3.40pm Year 1 from the South Gate
- 4.30pm All year groups from the West Gate

Up to 5.30pm – All year groups from the Main Gate

The Prep School

The Prep School consists of four year groups, Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 with one class per year group. They have regular term times with a one week half term each term, which is preceded by a staff professional day when the school is closed, and then holiday periods between each term.

Swimming and Computing are introduced from Year 1 onwards.

The doors to the Prep School open at 7.45am and are closed at 8.45am. The day starts formally at 8.50 am and pupils finish at 3.40 pm. For those pupils who will remain at School after this time we provide a variety of clubs, which are operated by qualified professionals, as well as care. Please see the section on Extra-curricular Clubs later in this booklet.

Absences caused by illness must please be notified by telephone on the first morning of absence, and by 8.30 am. Absences not caused by illness require the permission of the Headteacher and

Homework

Homework at HHS is as follows:

Early Years and Pre-Reception: There is no official homework for these year groups, but parents may choose to engage in specific learning activities with their pupils. These are shared in the weekly Early Years newsletter.

Reception: Homework packs for Reception will start to go home at the beginning of the Spring term along with instructions for completion. Reading is included in the weekly homework.

Year 1: 20 minutes of homework, 3 days per week

10 spelling words per week

10 minutes of reading per night

Year 2: 30 minutes of homework, 5 days per week

20 spelling words per week

10 minutes of reading per night

Year 3: 30 minutes of homework, 5 days per week

20 spelling words per week

10 minutes of reading per night

Please note, pupils may be assigned holiday homework during half-term and term breaks. These are optional and will be returned to school when the term resumes.

Pupils may also receive additional homework, such as handwriting or phonics, depending on their individual need. These assignments are generally part of a targeted support or intervention session designed to help pupils improve specific skills required by the curriculum.

Illness

The health and wellbeing of all the pupils, Staff and parents are of paramount importance to us. In order to maintain a clean and healthy environment we ask that you refrain from bringing your children into School if they are sick and/or displaying signs of illness.

Please view the Illness Policy on our website for information on our illness procedures, exclusion periods for illnesses, administering medication at school and contacting parents/carers about injuries.

Please note, we will not administer medication to your child at school without a completed 'Administration for Medication' form, which can be found on our website.

Rewards and Sanctions

HHS strives towards pupils taking personal responsibility for their actions through the development of mutually respectful relationships. We believe support systems, praise, and acknowledgment for good behaviour are an important part of developing confident learners.

We understand that the first step to modelling good behaviour is to lead by example, which means we expect all Staff, volunteers (and anyone else who comes to the school) to act responsibly and professionally. We work hard to ensure there is consistency across the school. The Senior Leadership Team (SLT) is present and routinely engages with pupils, parents, and staff to maintain the behaviour culture, encourage positive practices, and to ensure an environment where everyone feels safe and supported.

We implement a behaviour management system centered around praise. The whole school follows a behaviour chart. Further, depending on the age of the pupils, initiatives may include weekly achievement certificates, table points or acorn points for whole classes. It is important that pupils understand, acknowledge and accept the consequences of their actions when they fall short of expectations. Therefore, should pupils choose not to keep our Code of Conduct they will be given the following sanctions (dependent on the age of the child):

- Verbal warnings
- Relocating the child closer to the Teacher
- Moving the child down on the behavioural chart
- Time spent out of the classroom
- Discussions with their Head of Year or Headteacher


When poor behaviour is identified, serious sanctions can be implemented fairly and consistently in line with the school's behaviour policy. Examples of disciplinary measures are:

- Contact with parents verbal and written
- School based community service tidying a classroom
- Missing break times
- Setting written tasks as punishment apology letters

Learning Support at HHS

Hampstead Hill School is proudly non-selective. We welcome pupils with special educational needs and disabilities, providing that we can offer the support they require. From Reception Year onwards our curriculum changes, becoming increasingly academic and fast paced. So, at the end of Pre-Reception we will take the opportunity to discuss with parents whether or not progression into our Upper School will be to their child's best advantage, at this early stage in their educational journey.

Parents as Partners

HHS fully recognises the role that parents and other caregivers play in their child's educational journey, and acknowledges that parents are pivotal partners in identifying and meeting the needs of pupils with SEND. Interventions at School, especially when a programme of support has been devised by an external professional, are only truly successful if support is continued in the home setting, and we urge parents to ensure that time is given to continuing any such programme at home and in the holidays.

At HHS we provide a nurturing environment for your children to thrive in all areas of their Learning and Development. Parents are always welcome to email or arrange meetings with the SENDCo to discuss progress and concerns throughout the year.

Targeted Support

Our dedicated Targeted Support Team provide support for all pupils. With direction from of our Heads of Years, the Targeted Support Team use our assessment data to identify and support pupils requiring support or extension sessions. Typically, the sessions run weekly across a half-term — all pupils will complete a pre and post assessment to measure the impact of the targeted support.

Targeted Support is available for Pre-Prep and Prep pupils at Hampstead Hill School.

Forms of Targeted Support may include one-to-one, small groups for core subjects, reading, handwriting, phonics, gross motor skills and fine motor skills.

The aims of Targeted Support are:

- To provide further assistance for pupils who have been highlighted as needing additional support through assessment or observation.
- To better enable pupils to access the curriculum and learning targets.
- To supplement pupil's learning in accordance with Hampstead Hill School's curriculum.
- To provide one-to-one support as needed.
- To address misconceptions in the pupil's learning.
- To allow for small-group sessions in an environment free from classroom distractions.

Green Travel and the Environment

HomeRun App – School Journeys Platform

Hampstead Hill School works with HomeRun, an innovative app with a focus on strengthening School communities and improving School journeys for all. This app allows parents gain an insight into the activities that take place in class with photos posted by class teachers every week.

HomeRun increases journey sharing, allows journey monitoring (for those parents whose children travel independently) and enables parents and the School to share information without the need for contact details.

We have achieved a 10% reduction in car usage since joining Homerun!

We ask **ALL parents** to sign up to the service to support a more connected School community, improve our School runs and ensure that parents do not miss out on travel information. HomeRun provides a secure private network for our School and a facility for classes to post pictures of the children's activities.

Second Hand Uniform

Many of our parents donate second hand uniform for resale in aid of charity. If you wish to purchase any items we have in stock please ask at the Lower School admin desks. The proceeds of sale are donated to whichever charity we are fundraising for each year.



Sponsored Walk

Once a year, usually in May, children from Pre-Reception upwards undertake a sponsored charity walk on Hampstead Heath. Pupils will walk 5 miles. It is a thoroughly enjoyable day culminating in picnics at Kenwood House.

Communication From School

We use email as our main form of communication, so please check your messages regularly. We also use HomeRun to provide a window into the School, giving you continuous updates on life at HHS. In Early Years and Pre-Reception, ongoing observations and monitoring of pupils' progress are recorded via Tapestry. The assessment platform is used to record and share the progress with teachers and parents. Formal Target Reports are written for children in the Pre-Prep and Prep Schools. Please see the Home School Communication Policy for when these reports are distributed. A weekly newsletter is sent to parents for Upper School which showcases activities that occurred throughout the week, lists upcoming dates and shares reminders. The Early Years newsletter is sent biweekly.

Social Functions

Parent welcome Social evenings will take place in the Autumn Term, in St Stephen's. You will be notified by email of the dates for each Year Group. Parents Evenings will occur throughout the year for each year group. Parents will be notified in due course with a link to book a time slot.



Breakfast Provision

At HHS, we understand that many families may live far from school or have a long journey on public transport. Further, with so many parents running extremely busy lives, it is important that a School recognises the pressures of today's working arrangements.

Parents/carers whose children arrive at school between 7.45-8.15 may choose to send breakfast for their child to eat at school. This allows the children an adequate period to eat their breakfast prior to school starting at 8:45. Please note, this provision is only available for Early Years and Pre-Reception children. Please see the guidance below for details regarding our breakfast provision.

At HHS we will supervise pupils while eating their breakfast and assist children with eating if necessary. However, we will not warm up any food or cook any part of a pupils' breakfast.

Please note, we will provide cow's milk if needed, however, for any other varieties of milk, please ensure you provide your own.

Please ensure the breakfast you provide for your child is free from:

- All nuts, including nut butters and nut milks
- Sesame
- Strawberries
- Eggs and all products containing eggs, e.g. muffins, croissants and pastries

Please note, breakfast foods should be healthy such as, yoghurt, porridge, bagels, cereals and fruit.

Please ensure you cut up foods that may pose a choking hazard to children.

Together: We will build a happy, supportive and stimulating learning community and help teach pupils to:


- Do what they are asked by adults they know in School.
